Organization of the First PRC in the Philippines

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DAY) 2006 is a momentous day in the history of the Berean Church of God (Reformed). It's a day that was unlike any of the Lord's Days that we had been keeping since we started, first, as a fellowship, then, as a government registered church organization. It was special not only because it was our sixth anniversary but most especially because it was the day of our church's official institution—the culmination of our every hope and expectation, a most joyous realization that we too belong in the body of Christ.

How we have come to where we are now is truly a wonder. How we have hurdled every obstacle, trial and threat of peril (from within and from without), how we have triumphed over every force and foe bent on destroying and stopping us from prospering in our search for the truth and for that one true body of Christ, is a miracle that can only be understood and explained, in no other way, but by God's sovereign mercy and preserving grace. The accounts of our struggles and battles bear witness to that sovereign mercy and preserving grace of God. Let me give you some facts from the records of our own church's history.

"The Berean Church of God (Reformed) was born amidst a crisis that was shaking to the very foundation the former church of BCGR's majority members. Brought about by massive doctrinal changes and introduced new practices—the crisis

caused repercussions, varied sentiments, unprecedented reactions, and far-reaching impact in the organization. To the majority of the membership, it was seen as a "breach" in the established and long-cherished ideology, culture and traditions of the church, a legacy handed down by its leader and founder.

The same crises caused worldwide feelings of doubt and uncertainty on the membership's faith and beliefs. Questions were asked: Why are we making these changes? Had we been really in error in our doctrinal views and positions? If we were, then, what is the truth?

Needing answers and reassurance, members in search for the truth were driven to study and to investigate. Some began to attend other church denominations. Others attended theology schools. Others still bonded themselves together and started a serious and objective study of the Word of God.

Such was the case of some of these members. In Quezon City, a group, originally named as Q. C. Berean Fellowship (now BCGR) began to meet on December 8, 1998 at 6:30 p.m. at the ground floor of Maya Bldg., Cubao. Regularly convening on Thursday, they averaged some two and one half hours each meeting discussing a broad range of doctrinal topics and issues, and examining and searching the Scriptures in the way and fashion that was characteristic of the New Testament "Berean." Hence, the word "Berean" has since been used as distinctive of the group.

These Berean meetings proved to be significantly rewarding in many ways. To the truth-seeker, it was gratifying to find and discover that the fundamental teachings of the Scripture are plainly and directly taught in the Word of God. No extrabiblical interpretation are necessary. As a rule, they must always be interpreted in the light of the whole counsel of God. To the believer, it was comforting beyond description to prove right from the Scriptures the assurance that God's people are secured and can never fall from His grace. To the uninitiated, it was an awesome feeling to learn that Jesus Christ will never deny anyone who would come to Him.

In the next two years, the Bereans grew remarkably in their grasp and understanding of the Holy Scriptures and proved that the doctrinal positions of the Worldwide Church of God (both old and new positions) were unscriptural. Because of this, the inevitable ensued. Not wanting to be

partakers of falsehood and heresies, the Bereans, with twenty signatories, after a series of meetings and dialogues with the leadership of the Worldwide Church of God, and seeing no doctrinal reconciliation insight, tendered their resignation on October 31, 2000..."

In tendering our resignation, we made sure that we were understood. There was no mincing of words. We stated our reasons for writing, and defined and spelled-out the grounds for our doctrinal positions. We defended our cause and crusade for purity in faith and doctrine in the way of an apologist. And reasoned straight from the pure Word of God. We were ready for war, we were prepared for the consequences.

In church history, we could identify with Martin Luther when he took a firm and unflinching stand in the Diet of Worms in 1521 when he said, "Here I

stand. I cannot do otherwise. God help me. Amen." In secular history we could say with that Roman General who said, "The die is cast." Which means, no retreat, no more turning back. Our only option now, by God's grace, is: "To press on toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus" (Phil. 3:4).

This is the Berean Church of God (Reformed) before its institution. From its inception (which, incidentally, falls on Reformation Day) to the events following, e.g., contact with the Protestant Reformed Churches in America; continuing exchange of communication and series of

delegation visitations from the Foreign Mission Committee (FMC) and Doon PRC, and the eventual sending of a resident missionary to labor in the Philippines—have all been, undoubtedly, providential and a preparation of BCGR's institution.

This is where we had been; where we are going has been set before us in this day of our church organization.

The delegation from Doon PRC and Foreign Mission Committee, the trio of Rev. David Overway and Elders Alan VanBemmel and AllenBrummel, arrived in Manila on November 8. For some ten days prior to organization, they busied themselves visiting with BCGR members. On the 11th, they attended the board of trustees meeting and counseled with those who would be making public confessions of faith at the residence of a brother member. The



next day, Lord's Day, Rev. David Overway, delivered two preparatory sermons for the organization of the Berean fellowship—the first was entitled *Proper Behavior in the church* based on 1 Tim. 3:1-16; the second *The Mother Promise* based on Gen. 3:1-15. On the 18th, they took time to visit with

our fellow-saints in Gabaldon, Nueva Ecija, a municipality about 150 kilometers north of Manila. Joining the delegation and Pastor Spriensma were brethren Rod Bongat and Sonny Umali.

Now came the big day, November 19. the sixth anniversary and organization day. The usual two afternoon worship services were conducted. In the first at 1:00 o'clock, the sermon, By Grace, I Am What I am, based on 1 Cor. 15:1-11

was given by Pastor Audred Spriensma after which he conducted the public confessions of faith of fifteen persons and the baptisms of 5 adults and 5 children.

It was a moving experience for everyone of us witnessing the ceremony. One member of the delegation wrote sometime later, "It was with great joy that I could be with you during your organization. It was very emotional time for me. Especially the confessions of faith and the baptisms that we witnessed."

In the second worship service at 3:30, was the institution of the Berean Protestant Reformed Church in the


Philippines (BPRCP). Membership papers were received, the declaration of institution was made, and letters from the Doon PRC Council Foreign Mission Committee, and from the Protestant

Reformed Churches in America were read. Then it was followed by prayer, congregational siging, reading of I Samuel 7:1-14 and sermon by Rev. Audred Spriensma entitled, "Eben-




ezer: Thankful Remembrance and Joyful Hope." After the prayer the election office-bearers was conducted. Elected elders were Eric Mescallado and Rod Bongat and Edgardo Bansale as deacon. Then followed the installation of the newly elected office-bearers.

At the conclusion of the worship service, an atmosphere of joy and expressions of thankfulness from the general membership were simply overwhelming. And expectedly so. They had all the reasons to be. For the first PROTESTANT REFORMED CHURCH IN THE PHILIPPINES, the BPRCP, finally came to a reality. To God be the glory!

On Nov. 18, 2006, Saturday, our missionary pastor, Rev. Audred Sprie nsma, with the

delegation from Doon PRC, Rev. David Overway and Elder Alan VanBemmel, and Elder



Allen Brummel from the Foreign Mission Committee made a visit to Gabaldon fellowship to further provide support and encouragement heavily from the series of devastatn typhoons that hit the country last year. Thev found comfort in God's loving hands through the PR churches.



The day was a busy day for all of us. In the morning a Tagalog worship service was held at the house of one of the brethren. The service was attended by some fifteen believers including the delegation. With authorization from the mission committee, a word of edification based on the Beatitudes in Matthew 5 was delivered by yours truly.

After the service, a sumptuous lunch of local delicacies was prepared and served by the Gabaldon brethren. Shortly after, the ground-breaking ceremony for the construction of a church building on a 300 square-meter lot purchased by the group for the purpose of a future worship place was led by Rev. Spriensma. Rev. Spriensma prayed for God's blessing on the project.

Late in the afternoon, yours truly was again privileged to conduct a Bible study, also in Tagalog, in another brother's house on the Five Solas of the Reformation.

The whole day affair was a picture of warm and pleasant fellowship of the saints. Before departure time, the brethren took turns in thanking God for Rev. Spriensma's efforts and the PRC's kind and wholehearted support.

The delegation particularly was pleased with the brethren's hospitality, simplicity and zeal to learn and grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

With all the encouraging developments taking place in our fellowship, we have high hope of a fruitful gospel labors ahead of us. With the support and assistance being extended to us in various ways by the PRCA through the Berean PRC, we are confident that our labors together for the gospel's sake will be God-glorifying.
